



**Rosemarie Nagel**

Rosemarie Nagel is Professor of Economics at Universitat Pompeu Fabra. Her main research is experimental and behaviour economics focusing on simplified economic situations of risk, coordination, and competition. She develops descriptive models introducing knowledge from psychology and neurosciences related to the theory of mind. She links behavioral data with brain activity gained through functional magnetic resonance imaging or eye-tracking data co-working with cognitive scientists, neuroscientists, biologists, and psychologists. Furthermore, with experimental economists and macro theorists, and recently with computational economists, she applies experimental tools to tackle macro and computational questions.



**Ariell Reshef**

Ariell Reshef is a CNRS Researcher (Directeur de Recherche) at the Centre d'Economie de la Sorbonne, Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, and is an Associate Member of the Paris School of Economics. His research interests focus on income distribution – in particular, the relationship of labour markets with global trade, technological change, regulation, and with the long run evolution of the financial sector. His work lies at the intersection of international trade, labour economics, and macroeconomics, and it studies changes in human capital, skills, and wages.



**Uta Schönberg**

Uta Schönberg is Professor of Economics at University College London. Her research interests are in applied microeconomics, in particular labor economics. Topics she is currently working on include: the role of firms in the rise of wage inequality the impact of business taxation on local labor markets, firms and workers. She is currently a Joint Managing Editor at the Review of Economic Studies. In 2019, she received a 5-year ERC Consolidator Grant from the European Research Council for her project "Wage inequality within and across firms: the role of market forces, government and firm policies".
